Coca-Cola in Australia is primarily sweetened with cane sugar, unlike in the United States where it is sweetened with high-fructose corn syrup. This difference in sweetener is a key factor contributing to the taste difference between the Australian and American versions of Coca-Cola. High-fructose corn syrup is not commonly used in Australia, it is used extensively overseas in products such as soft drinks, and it may be present in imported items.

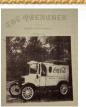


As you know, the "Share a Coke" campaign originated in Australia and was first launched in 2011. But did you know the campaign was in response to a decade word-wide decline in Coca-Cola sales. This was thought to be due to teenagers and young adults not drinking Coca-Cola as the brand was seen as being "out dated" and more suited to older generations. This was most apparent in Australia where statistics in 2010 indicated that half of Australia's young population had never tried Coca-Cola. The Australian Coca-Cola team started brainstorming ideas to connect Teens with Coke. They realised that this age group was now living in a digital age and that through marketing and social media there was a massive opportunity to reconnect this generation with Coke by getting them to "Share a Coke" with their friends. The campaign was marketed via print, TV, social media, famous influencers and billboards, even giving people the chance to text their name to Coca-Cola who would display their name on the billboards in real time. By changing the labels on every single Coke product, adding the 150 most popular Australian names (which accounted for 42% of the Australian population) they got these millennials excited about finding their name on a Coke product and sharing this on social media with their friends. They also set up 18 kiosks in shopping centres across Australia where people could custom print their name on cans, thus ensuring everyone could have their name on a Coke. The campaign was a huge success, in less than a year they saw a 7% increase in consumption among millennials with 250 million Coke products sold (averaging 10 per person), their online presence saw 500,000 plus photos shared on social media with the hashtag "Share a coke", 76,000 being the Coca-Cola billboards. There Facebook page and website saw a significant increase in traffic. What started in Australia became a global phenomenon spreading to over 80 countries. In 2025, Coca-Cola is revamping its "Share a Coke" campaign in Australia to engage a new generation of consumers and highlight the importance of social connections. It is offering personalized cans and bottles with up to 200 names and nicknames and will include more than 120 countries around the world.



Club History

The first newsletter for the club was published in 1992 and was called The Queensland Coca-Cola Memorabilia Collectors Club newsletter. By the 9th edition it had its forever name of The Quencher following calls to its members for a new name.







Between 1992 and 2012 there were 11 different editors, these included Wayne Lawson, Helen Morris, Val McCallum, Carol Lindsey, Majella Ney, Gail Fullick, Vicki McCallum, Col Mullins, Lyn Kraudelt, Francis McDonald and Martin Lindsay, bringing Coca-Cola and club news to all members. It appears the newsletter took a hiatus in 2013 before being brought back to life by Col Mullins, who in an impressive 10-year reign as editor produced a colourful and informative newsletter for all club members. Coca-Cola Fudge

½ cup Coca-Cola

- 3 tablespoons white sugar
- 1 tin (395g) sweetened condensed milk
- 3 cups chocolate chips
- 5 tablespoons butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1^{1/3} cups walnuts (chopped)

SERVES: 36



Taste tested and member approved

DIRECTIONS

- Add Coca-Cola and sugar in saucepan over medium heat until gently boiling. Continue until mixture has become thickened and syrupy (reduced to about 1/3 cup).
- 2) Stir in sweetened condensed milk and bring back to gentle boil, then remove from heat.
- Pour hot mixture into heat proof bowl with chocolate chips, butter, vanilla and 1 cup of walnuts. Stir until chocolate is melted and everything combined.
- 4) Spread fudge into lined tin (approx. 8x8cm) and top with remaining walnuts.
- 5) Refrigerate for at least 2 hours to set before slicing.
